**T**he Oxford Centre for Islamic Studies (OCIS) is offering up to five scholarships to students applying to undertake graduate study at the University of Oxford in any field other than medicine. The awards cover University and College fees and a maintenance grant. Awards may be offered in conjunction with other sources of funding, although other funding will be taken into account when determining the value of the OCIS award.

### **Purpose of Scholarships**

The purpose of the Scholarships is to encourage and assist students to undertake studies that will be of benefit to the Muslim world. Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of academic merit and financial need. Applicants must be able to show how their intended course of study is of relevance to the Muslim world.

## What is funded?

The Scholarship enables students to undertake graduate study by offering fees and maintenance support. It is available for students from 50 countries (please see below for the full list of eligible countries). Up to five awards will be available; two of which will be offered to UK Muslim students.



The closing date for applications for Graduate OCIS Scholarships coincides with the University of Oxford's January application deadline.
