- A five-month period of research at the Oxford Centre for Islamic Studies
- Living expenses for the duration of the Fellowship
- Return economy airfare from your home country to the UK
- Allowances to cover insurance and visa costs

Fellows will contribute to the Centre's mission of promoting international collaboration and mutually productive exchange of ideas and perspectives. They are encouraged to participate actively in the academic and social activities on offer at the Centre.

## Eligibility

Citizens of Afghanistan, Algeria, Azerbaijan, Bangladesh, Egypt, Indonesia, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Lebanon, Libya, Malaysia, Morocco, Nigeria, Pakistan, Palestine, Philippines, Sudan, Syria, Tunisia, Türkiye, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan are eligible to apply for these Fellowships.
