

The Oxford Centre for Islamic Studies (OCIS) is offering up to five scholarships to students ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom and from a Muslim community applying to study for a first degree at the University of Oxford in any field other than medicine. The awards cover University fees and a maintenance grant. Awards may be offered in conjunction with other sources of funding, although that will be taken into account when determining the value of the OCIS award.

Purpose of Scholarships

The purpose of the Scholarships is to encourage students to pursue studies that will be of benefit to Muslim communities and society. Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of academic merit and financial need, and the relevance of the intended course of study to the needs of British Muslims. Applicants must have applied to UCAS and the University of Oxford, as described on its Undergraduate Admissions website.

The academic year in Oxford begins in October. The deadline for receipt of applications for these awards is mid-February in the same year.
