The Oxford Centre for Islamic Studies (OCIS) and The Prince's Charities will be holding the fifteenth **Young Muslim Leadership Programme (YMLP)** at the Oxford Centre for Islamic Studies between 28 August and 6 September 2020.

This intensive residential summer school is open to Muslim men and women between the ages of 21 and 30. Applicants must be British citizens.

The aims of the Young Muslim Leadership Programme are to enable participants to become confident in their identity as Muslims living in the United Kingdom, to be aware of their responsibilities to the wider society, and to relate their own personal development more effectively to this context.

As a participant YMLP can help you:

- Reflect on where your personal and professional energies align to develop increased commitment to personal and professional goals.
- Enhance levels of confidence to take on ever greater challenges.
- Help develop specific leadership techniques and styles.
- Practice networking skills with speakers and other participants from a wide spectrum of backgrounds.

Programme

The focus of the Young Muslim Leadership Programme is on the national role and contribution of Muslim communities in Britain. It consists of workshops, seminars, and visits to prominent national institutions. Guest speakers are drawn from Parliament, academia, non-governmental organizations, the civil service, and the media. There are opportunities for networking and social interaction which facilitate contacts and potentially lifelong friendships among those participating. The Young Muslim Leadership Programme is an invaluable forum for young British Muslims with strong leadership potential to come together and consider key issues affecting British society.

Applications

The cost of the Programme is £2000 per participant. While participants are expected to seek funding for their place on the course, there are a number of bursaries and partial bursaries available. Finance should not act as a barrier to anyone taking up a place on the Programme.

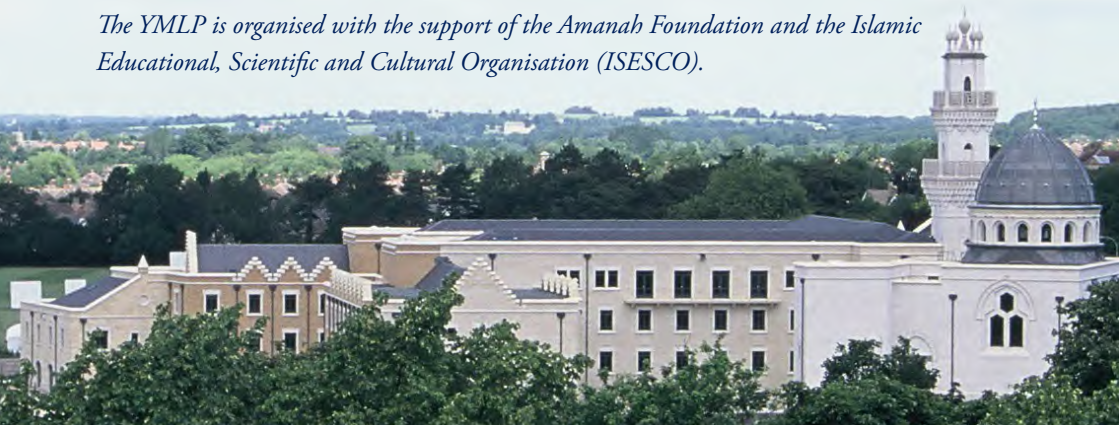
